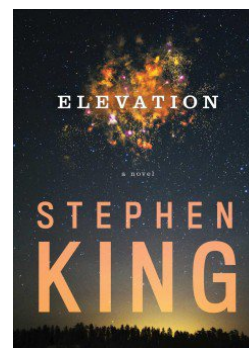
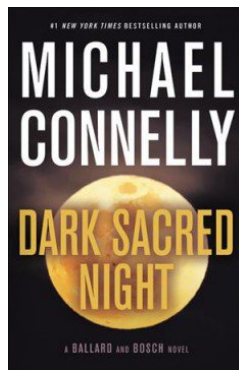
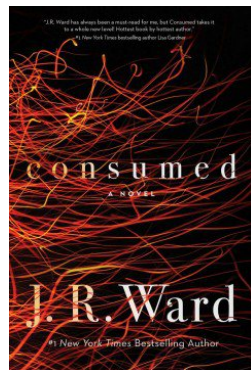
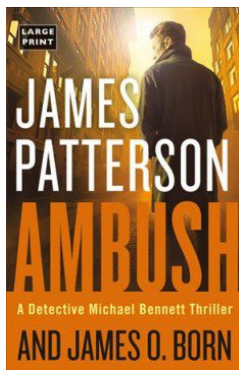
The White Darkness by David Grann
