 - **Forensic Examination:** where do I go? - Specially trained to handle sexual assault cases, Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE) are available 24 hours a day at USA Children's and Women's Hospital in Mobile, AL. If you have been assaulted, a forensic exam can be performed and evidence collected up to 120 (preferably within 72) hours

after the assault. Victim participation is at the discretion of the victim while at the hospital. A victim may decline any or all parts of the exam and choose whether to report to law enforcement. Trained volunteer advocates will meet you at the hospital.

Domestic, criminal, and juvenile courts, community programs, and parents can make referrals for supervised visitation. There are fees associated with this program, with discounts offered if parents engage in other Family Center programs. Visitation is available by appointment only in both offices, seven days a week.

This service is available to any parent but focuses on parents with restraining orders or other domestic violence concerns.
